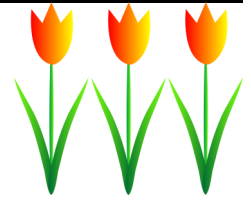

Village Taxes

Village of Hammondsport Real Property Taxes can be paid in two installments with the first installment totaling one half of the total tax, due beginning March 1, 2016 and the second installment totaling one half of the total tax, due beginning July 1, 2016. First installment must be paid by June 30, 2016 to allow for two installment payments. If first installment is not paid by June 30, 2016 standard payment plan exists.

First installment, one half total tax due: Penalties due and payable on first installment amount only.

March 1—March 31, 2016

No Penalty

Second installment, one half total tax due: Penalties due on second installment amount only.

July 1—July 31, 2016

No Penalty

Please note: Second Notices will not be mailed—Taxpayer is responsible for second payment if paying in installments.

Tax bills can be viewed and printed off the Village website.

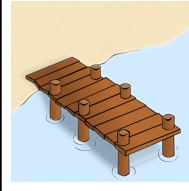

Recycling tips:

Items should be clean and free from any food and liquid. Tops to all containers should be placed in trash, all containers should be flattened. All shredded paper should be placed in a clear plastic trash bag.

ALL RECYCLING CAN BE IN ONE CONTAINER

- Symbol #1 CodePET :** Polyester fibers, soft drink bottles
#2 PEHD or HDPE : Plastic bottles, plastic bags, trash cans, imitation wood
#3 PVC: Bottles for chemicals, flooring
#4 PELD or LDPE: Plastic bags, buckets, soap dispenser bottles, plastic tubes
#6 PS: Toys, flower pots, video cassettes, ashtrays, trunks
#7 O (Other)

Common Recycled Items:

- Clear, brown, green glass food containers
- Metal containers
- Aluminum pie pans
- Single-serving trays
- Plastic food, personal care, and household cleaning product containers
- Paper milk and juice containers
- Telephone books
- Office paper
- Envelopes without the window
- Magazines, catalogs & colored paper
- Flattened clean cardboard
- Clean newspaper

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS:

- Window glass
- Light bulbs
- Drinking glasses
- Ceramics
- China
- Pyrex
- Aerosol cans
- Paint cans
- Pesticide or other chemical containers
- Styrofoam trays
- Egg cartons
- Motor oil containers
- Carbon paper
- Plastic wrappers
- Crayon marked paper
- Tape or labels on cardboard

Trash Pickup Day 2016



Trash pick up day is scheduled for Monday June 6, 2016 Village DPW will pick up trash at the curb. All items must be out no later than the night of June 5, 2016.

APPLICANCES WILL BE ACCEPTED

The following items **will not** be accepted:

- Household Garbage
- Yard Debris
- Paint and Paint Thinner
- Concrete
- Tires

Notice: The Village of Hammondsport Street Department will pick up brush, leaves, and lawn clippings on the **First and Third Monday of the Month.** Leaves and lawn clippings must be in containers no heavier than 50 pounds. **Tree limbs are to be NO longer than five feet and bundled.** All items must be placed at the curb the night before.



The Town of Urbana compost, located off Route 54, behind the Town Barn, is open all the time. Any clean brush, leaves or wood can be deposited in designated areas marked signs. No plastic or trash. The mulch is free of charge to anyone living in the Town of Urbana.

Property Maintenance

Please be mindful of your neighborhood. The Village Code states that hedges and shrubs shall be kept pruned or trimmed so they do not grow over the sidewalks. Grass shall not be permitted to grow over 8 inches. Property owners must maintain every part of their property free from litter, rubbish, solid waste, and junk. Thank you for your consideration.



Building season is here and in most cases, zoning and building permits are required.



Please Note: Village and State Codes regulate residential rental units. If you are considering renting property or a portion of property, whether nightly, weekly or monthly, it is advisable to check with Village officials to see if any permits are required.

Trivia Answer: 1874. The library was established at a drug store at Shether and Mechanic Streets and it contained 388 books. It first moved in 1883 to Pulteney Street up from the current Post Office, then to the Academy Building in 1896, back to Shether Street in 1935 and then again to the Academy Building in 1962. In 2006, the library moved to its current location and the first building specifically built to house a library.
