

Hammondsport-Urbana Waterfront Master Plan

This summer, the Village of Hammondsport and Town of Urbana boards endorsed the final recommendations of the Waterfront Plan. The final plan was the result of an eight month joint effort between the Village, Town of Urbana and the Steuben county IDA where passionate citizens from both communities that live, work, and play within the waterfront area came together to share concerns, ideas, and their vision for the waterfront. The final recommendations develop a roadmap where the waterfront will be recognized for its rich history, charming character, and spectacular scenic quality.

The Waterfront Plan looks to advance 29 recommendations that will advance this vision. These goals are both physical and policy orientated and create a waterfront that provides exceptional public access to the water, recreational opportunities, local businesses that address the needs of residents as well as visitors while respecting the ecological systems that characterize the peaceful nature of the community. From these recommendations the plan also outlines four priority projects which were identified by the community as critical first steps in this effort. Those projects include the establishment of an oversight council to advance the recommendations, redevelopment of the Champlin Beach pier, development of a waterfront center at the Champlin Beach area, and the development of a trail network linking the waterfront assets.

Work began immediately on moving these recommendations to reality. The Town of Urbana submitted an application to the Southern Tier Regional Economic Development Council in July to seek funding to reconstruct the pier and attract a tour boat back to the lake. The state will announce grant recipients in December. The community will also be working to establish an oversight council this fall to help oversee the implementation of the plan.

Trivia answer: On June 20, 1892 the village board voted to approve building a bandstand in Pulteney Park at a cost not to exceed \$150.00. It is called a **bandstand** not a gazebo because it was constructed as a covered outdoor platform for the purpose of hosting band concerts in the park.

A **gazebo** is a covered structure in a garden or park, open on all sides designed to command a view.

BAUDER AVENUE

There has been some confusion with the correct pronunciation of Bauder Avenue which is located off Lake Street along the Curtiss School property. Bauder rhymes with daughter, gaudy, laundry, or dawn. It is not pronounced Boudier. The street was named after the Bauder family that owned Bauder Boat Works. Also, the village has it listed as Bauder **Avenue** and Steuben county tax roll as Bauder **Street**. I guess we will need to correct that too!
