The Village of Hammondsport Board of Trustees held its regular monthly board meeting on Tuesday, July 13, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. in the Village Office, 18 Water Street, Hammondsport and via ZOOM teleconference.

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Jean Jensen announcing that the current COVID pandemic regulations have been lifted.

BUSINESS MEETING:

Minutes: On motion of Trustee Hoch, seconded by Trustee Kleckner, and carried, all voting Aye to approve the Regular Meeting minutes of June 8, 2021.

Abstract: On motion of Trustee Pulver, seconded by Trustee Hoch and carried, all voting Aye, **RESOLVED**, that the Clerk-Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay General Fund Abstract #5, Claims #151-188 totaling \$21,436.81 and Water Fund Abstract #5, Claims #58-77, totaling \$13,219.46.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

Police: Sergeant Jason Dininny submitted a written report of the Police Department. Activities included but were not limited to: 269 calls for service, 0 arrests (total for year=1), 4 criminal investigations, 3 navigation law investigation, 1 alarms, 6 assist other agencies, 4 bike patrols, 1 disorderly conduct, 3 domestic incidents, 1 drug

complaint, 1 escort, 23 follow-up investigations, 49 foot patrols, 2 hazardous conditions, 15 meetings, 27 property checks, 1 lost/found property, 1 mental health investigation, 1 motor vehicle crash investigations, 1 police record checks, 12 school zone patrols, 4 suspicious conditions, 6 traffic complaints, 17 traffic detail, 0 traffic ticket issued, 16 traffic stops, 30 police shift coverage, 0 use of force incidents, 0 personal complaints, 105.2 gallons used, 522 miles travelled. Helped create public safety day with school, 3 presentations on driver safety, conducted 2 boater safety courses (50-60 students), Bryce is on his way on training, would like to purchase a laptop-work with Tina, order dept. ammo (will need firearm training in fall).

DPW: DPW Superintendent Hawley submitted a written report on the DPW. Activities included but were not limited to mowed, shop work, repaired fence in Grape St. Park, cleaned ditches on Liberty, patched streets, brush pick up, ran sweeper, weed-eated roadsides, top soiled, ladders at beach, rubble removal, cleaned off catch basins, took down deaf child signs, stripped streets, took trees down, ran sweeper for school, cleaned where sweeper can't get and picked up salt from hospital. Thank Steve Veley for the 15-20 tons of treated salt. Avoca gave us free gutter brooms-saved \$400.

Water Plant: Supervisor McConnell submitted a written report on the Water Plant activities. Activities included but were not limited to pumphouse, turbidity, residuals, samples, UFPOS, meter repairs, mowed, cleaned pumphouse, ready for sanitary survey, Nigel's evaluation, pumped pit, re-read some meters, cleaned out hydrants, leak location, cleaned out tank truck, cleaned off reservoir, changed and cleaned filter, moved D.E. and monthly report. Nigel received water license, sanitary survey-will need generator, want to hire Preston back to clear back around reservoir, turbidity meters are in-will be installed, talked about leak, still checking.

Finance: Village Clerk submitted a written report of the Clerk's Office activities. Need balance sheet. Working on closing of year end.

Town of Urbana: Trustee Hoch discussed speed reduction on 87, dragon boat, Camp Good Days for Tour de Teddy, tax assessor apprenticeship, nothing more on bridge, David Oliver is writing the grant for Rails to Trails.

Trustee Pulver made a motion, seconded by Trustee Hoch, and carried, all voting Aye, to accept the Committee Reports.

OLD BUSINESS:

On motion of Trustee Kleckner, seconded by Trustee Hoch and carried all voting Aye to adopt the 2020 Comprehensive Plan.

Bandstand Update/Estimate-look for grant(Mr. Orman to help), Trustee Hoch wants more quotes, Trustee Kleckner has done research and says many others use that mahogany wood. Talked about replacing trees in center mound near grocery store.

Trustee Hoch wants the beautification committee to come and present.

On motion of Trustee Pulver, seconded by Trustee Hoch and carried all voting Aye to approve the Smoke On The Water BBQ Competition Banner.

CORRESPONDENCE: Discussed NYCLASS info. and said, we were meeting with them.

Park View Wines and Spirits-how to enforce 15 minute parking. Suggest parking in bank for vendors, Trustee Hoch thinks unenforceable, Trustee Kleckner thinks curtesy only.

Will encourage Sam Pennise to talk to vendors, Trustee Hoch said make vendors aware of other parking. Also mentioned electric charging stations.

Chamber of Commerce-Can't have a handicap parking out front due to requirements and the street reconstruction after septic lines are placed.

PUBLIC COMMENT: Next steps on Comprehensive Plan-2 items from public hearing to discuss and asking community members to help. Requested what the state was on the Marina (underwater land use)-Not sure if the Town of Urbana sent in a letter.
